#### **CHECK-IN EVENT ON AUG 27-28**

#### **Bring these documents:**

- Passport or EU Citizen's ID card
- Residence permit if applicable, or EU Citizen's registration document if applicable
- Certificate of student status printed from Sisu, or digital version
- Address in Finland, including the number of your apartment/room
- Arrival Certificate (printed, if your home university requires one)
- Bank receipt of the HYY student union membership payment (optional & only if you did not send it already to <u>studentinfo@helsinki.fi</u>)
- Credit/debit card (for HSL, ESN & HYY membership fee)

Your tutor will collect the documents that need to be signed for you by the **International Exchange Services**.

## STUDENT UNION MEMBERSHIP & STUDENT CARD



If you wish to get the Frank App (digital student union card), become a member of the Student Union by September 30



The membership fee for the autumn term is **45** euros.



If you become a member after the Check-in Event, you can send a photo of the receipt to student services by e-mail <a href="mailto:studentinfo@helsinki.fi">studentinfo@helsinki.fi</a>



- HSL Travel Card
  - BSc / MSc exchange students: Student discount (40% on season tickets)
  - You can get the physical card at the CiE and later upload value on your card
  - PhD students: Not entitled to a student discount, but you can get the local price for adults after registering your address with the DVV (Digital Population Services)
- VR & Matkahuolto (long distance transportation) discounts can be obtained only if you join the student union (HYY) by September 30
  - Student Discount on VR train tickets
  - Student discount on Matkahuolto intercity bus services



## AT THE CHECK-IN EVENT 1/3

#### Make sure that you have filled in these:

- HSL travel discount form (you get this from your tutor)
- DVV registration e-form online
  - Before you register via the DVV e-form:
    - Download a certificate of student status from Sisu
    - Attach the certificate of student status to the <u>DVV registration form!</u>
    - Copy of your passport or EU citizen's ID card and residence permit (if applicable) - make sure that you have attached pictures of both the front and backside of the card
      - A driver's license is not an official id and will not be accepted

Your tutor will collect your documents that need to be signed by **International Exchange Services**.



## AT THE CHECK-IN EVENT 2/3

- When you arrive to the Language Centre, scan the QR code to get your queue number for the DVV
- In every room, there is a screen with the next three numbers that are served at DVV
- Visit various stands and collect stamps until your turn to visit DVV approaches
- Have all your documents ready when you go to the DVV
- Bring the same identification document that you have attached to your application
- Leave HSL for last!
- EU/ETA citizens: if you will not leave Finland within 3 months, you can visit Migri to register your residency in room 406. In this case, please cancel any pre-booked appointments

### **REGISTERING WITH FINNISH** AUTHORITIES **EXCHANGE STUDENTS**

#### Nordic Countries

Apply for a personal identity code with DVV eform

Complete the process at Check-in Event

\* If you have a residence permit for studies in another EU country, you may not need a residence permit to Finland but instead you must submit a mobility notification at Migri.

#### EU/EEA Countries

Apply for a personal identity code with DVV e-form

Complete the process at Checkin Event

In addition:

+ Travel outside the borders within 3 months

or

Apply for a right to reside in Finland at the Finnish Immigration Service MIGRI You can visit MIGRI at CiE

- Apply online to register for an EU citizen's right of residence

#### Non-EU Countries\* (includes UK citizens) Do you already have a personal identity code? If you do, it will be on the front side of your residence permit. It is a number sequence with 11 characters, formed on the basis of your date of birth. ## AFTER RECEIVING YOUR IDENTITY CODE

Once you have received your Finnish personal identity code, update it in the student register by <u>ONE</u> of the following methods:

- Visit the <u>Student Services</u>
   Bring with you proof of your new identity code and your official ID
- 2. Email <u>studentinfo@helsinki.fi</u>
  - Include the last four digits of your personal identity code
  - State your student number






### **LEARNING AGREEMENT**

## INDIVIDUAL ARRANGEMENTS FOR STUDIES

- Individual arrangements support your learning when your studying is hindered, for example, by a long-term illness, disability or impediment.
- If you require these arrangements during your stay at UH, contact <u>specialneeds@helsinki.fi</u> with a description of your needs and certificates related to them asap!
- The Accessibility Liaison Officer of your host Faculty will guide you with the arrangements at the University of Helsinki based on the certificates you send

#### TRANSCRIPT OF RECORDS

- Includes all courses you have passed at UH:
  - Failed courses will not appear in your transcript
  - It is not possible to delete courses from the transcript
- You can download a digitally verified transcript from Sisu.
- You will receive more information closer to your departure in one of our Newsletters.



### YOUR UH EMAIL

- The University of Helsinki uses Office365 mail system and you will get your own email with the helsinki.fi ending.
- Log in (activate the e-mail) as soon as possible.
- If you don't use this e-mail, forward the messages to your own e-mail, so that you don't miss out on important information.
- Multifactor Authentication is used regularly. The Authenticator mobile app is the easiest option for this.



#### **HEALTHCARE**

- Availability of healthcare services depends on your nationality.
- Please check our instructions on <u>Healthcare for exchange students</u> now so you know what to do if health concerns occur.
- In urgent cases call the free Medical Helpline number 116 117 before visiting a health station or emergency department.
- If you have a life-threatening emergency, please call 112.



#### HOUSING

- Join online housing session on Friday August 29 for detailed information by Hoas and Unihome
- Respect other students and avoid making noise especially during silent time 22:00 07:00
- Take good care of the apartment and common areas
  - It is strictly forbidden to smoke inside (not even through the windows)
- Pay the rent on time
- Take care of the keys
  - If you forget your keys inside the apartment or lose them, you have to pay expenses incurred.
  - Do not hand over the keys to anybody.
- You are liable to pay for all the damage you (and any other person whom you have let in)
  cause
- UH may contact student's home university if disturbances occur
