

# LANGUAGE AND COMMUNICATION STUDIES INCLUDED IN A BACHELOR'S DEGREE

- All <u>bachelor's degrees include min. 10 cr of compulsory communication and language studies</u>:
  - Foreign language 4 cr: e.g. English, Spanish, Italian, French, German, Russian, Chinese, Arabic
    - o starting skill level in English: CEFR B2, in other languages: CEFR B1
  - Second national language 3 cr (Swedish/Finnish)
  - Native language 3 cr (Finnish/Swedish)
- Studies can be completed in many different course forms (contact, distance, blended and online teaching or independent project) or by passing an exemption test.
- NB! The language of your secondary education affects the completion of these studies.



## LANGUAGE AND COMMUNICATION STUDIES INCLUDED IN A MASTER'S DEGREE

- Students studying in the Master's Programmes and needing the Academic Writing Courses (English) for the degree, can find the courses with the following codes:
  - KK-ENG501 Academic Writing 1: Principles and Practice (Master's Students CEFR C1)
  - KK-ENG502 Academic Writing 2: Process and Feedback (Master's Students CEFR C1)
  - KK-ENG504 Advanced English: Feedback on Writing (CEFR C1)
- NB! If you are pursuing a master's degree only, if the language of your secondary education is Finnish or Swedish and if you have completed your bachelor's degree abroad, you have to complete in your master's degree the language and communication studies normally included in a bachelor's degree.

- From intermediate level:
  - o ITALIAN

#### **ALICE COURSES**

- Academic Language and Intercultural Exchange
- Two language learners who speak different first languages have the opportunity to learn each other's language in an interactive way.
- Participants gain insight into each other's cultures including its customs and receive information about the practicalities of everyday life.
- ALICE courses run in Italian, French, German and Spanish.



## COURSE ASSISTANT PROGRAMME

Students as course assistants help fellow students in language learning in Language Centre's and in some Faculty of Art's language courses. Most course assistants are first language speakers, but it's not a must!

- Integrates international students into our University community.
- Gives students the opportunity to meet fellow students and language teachers.

- Brings new aspects and possibilities to language learning and teaching.
