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DRAW A PYRAMID OF YOUR WORK PREFERENCES

Why?

It can be difficult to formulate your career goals. You can have several areas of interest, which can lead to a dizzying number of options. It can also be hard to find out what different work duties and roles actually do entail. It is nevertheless useful to consider the characteristics you prefer your future job to have. It can help you narrow down your goals, which can then help you identify opportunities and look for a job.

How?

- 1. Choose as many characteristics and preferences from the following list as you like. Hopefully the list will inspire you to add some new preferences, too. Add them to your list!
- 2. Then start narrowing down your chosen preferences, leaving only the ten most important. If you struggle with narrowing down your list, try ranking them in order of importance:
 - Compare the preferences with one another one by one. First compare preference 1 with preference 2 and pick the most important one. Mark the most important preference with a tick and continue the comparison: preference 1 with 3, 1 with 4, and so on.
 - When you have compared preference 1 with all others on your list, repeat the process with preference 2, comparing it with preference 3, 4, 5 and so on. Repeat the process until you have compared all preferences.
 - Which ten preferences scored the most points?
- 3. Draw a pyramid, and place the top ten characteristics to it, with the most important on top.
- 4. What does your pyramid look like? What thoughts does it evoke? How does it fit in with your plans for the future? If you were to write a short description of the characteristics of your dream job, how would it read?
